

Coastal Flood Warning

IMPACTS:

- The airstrip will be impacted
- Water will inundate many buildings on the inlet side of town including the clinic, library, and water treatment plant
- Wave run-up from the coast will inundate buildings near the sewage lagoon

What to Expect:

<u>Water levels:</u> 5-7 feet above the normal high tide line.

<u>Timing:</u> The highest water levels will occur late this evening into early morning Sunday.

<u>Winds</u>: Southeast winds 35 to 45 mph gusting to 65 mph with peaking today and then decreasing.

- Significant erosion is likely






Orange is the anticipated area of inundation for water levels of 7ft above the normal highest tide line. This does not account for wave run-up.
