If passed, this initiative would be a significant step—bringing multiple generations into the BSNC family.

We continue to prioritize shareholder hire and are excited about emerging opportunities. Our Shareholder Development team works with BSNC hiring managers to support applicants and identify qualified shareholders. Through hiring practices, training, and career development, we are preparing shareholders and descendants for meaningful employment. As Graphite One moves into the permitting phase, BSNC remains a committed partner. Our early engagement reflects our focus

on supporting responsible development and ensuring our communities have a voice in the process. We will continue working to align opportunities with long-term regional benefits.

To prepare for trucking demands tied to the Utqiagvik seawall project, Port of Nome expansion, and potential Graphite One activity, BSNC is developing a Commercial Driver’s License (CDL) training program. This initiative will help build a regional workforce of certified drivers and create new career pathways for shareholders interested in transportation and logistics.

One of the most rewarding parts of my role is visiting our shareholders and communities. Thank you to everyone who has attended and supported our informational meetings. Please continue to share your thoughts—I look forward to hearing from you and seeing you at upcoming meetings.

I’m also looking forward to processing fish and berry picking this summer. I hope your subsistence efforts are successful. Please take care of yourselves and one another.

EVALUATING OPEN ENROLLMENT: *A Decade of Careful Thought*



BSNC was formed in 1972 as the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) regional Alaska Native Corporation (ANC) for the Bering Strait region. BSNC began with 6,333 original shareholders. Today, through gifting and inheritance, BSNC's shareholder base has grown to more than 8,200 shareholders.

A 1991 amendment to ANCSA expanded the ways ANCs could evolve by granting corporations, through a shareholder vote, the discretion to modify shareholder eligibility criteria. This amendment allowed ANCs to enroll direct lineal descendants of original shareholders. Since then, six of the twelve regional corporations have elected to issue new shares to descendants.

In 2012, the Board of Directors established the Open Enrollment Subcommittee to explore the feasibility of opening shareholder rolls to descendants of original shareholders. Since then, the Board has conducted thorough evaluations, incorporating shareholder feedback, financial analysis, and the long-term vision for BSNC's future.

Over the years, multiple shareholder surveys have been conducted to assess support

for open enrollment. The responses show growing support among shareholders for expanding the rolls. BSNC's steady financial growth has contributed to this shift, offering shareholders greater confidence in the Corporation's ability to provide benefits to an expanded shareholder base.

In December 2024, in response to overwhelming shareholder support, the BSNC Board voted unanimously to present opening enrollment for a shareholder vote on the 2025 proxy. The resolution details were carefully developed based on shareholder feedback from the surveys, ensuring that the proposed amendments reflect the priorities and concerns of Our People. This decision reflects the Board's commitment to shareholder input and its responsibility to ensure BSNC remains responsive to the needs of Our People. By placing the vote on the proxy, the Board empowers shareholders to determine the future of BSNC's enrollment policies, ensuring alignment with the corporation's mission, values and long-term sustainability.

SHAREHOLDER VOTE:

Open Enrollment

In August 2025, shareholders will vote on whether or not to open enrollment to lineal descendants of original shareholders. If the majority of shareholders vote yes, 50 new Class C shares of BSNC Settlement Common Stock would be issued to individuals who enroll and are:

1. **A lineal descendant of an original shareholder of BSNC, including:**
 - a. Individuals who are the natural children of an original shareholder, or a lineal descendant of an original shareholder, and were adopted before their age of majority by someone who is not a shareholder or a lineal descendant of an original shareholder;
 - b. Individuals who are adopted before their age of majority by an original shareholder or a lineal descendant of an original shareholder
2. **A United States citizen; and**
3. **Not a shareholder of another Alaska Native regional corporation** unless they received those shares through gifting or inheritance.

The vote will also include issuing new Class D shares of BSNC Settlement Common Stock to “missed enrollees.” Missed enrollees refer to any Native (as that term is defined in the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA)) who is a citizen of the United States and is not an original shareholder of another Alaska Native regional corporation (including the 13th Regional Corporation) except by gifting or inheritance, and who was eligible on December 18, 1971 for enrollment in BSNC pursuant to ANCSA but did not enroll. Missed enrollees would receive 100 Class D shares upon enrollment.

In mid-August, BSNC shareholders can expect to receive their Proxy Materials in the mail. Once received, we encourage all shareholders to vote their proxy. Please note: there are many exciting proxy prizes available! Please assist the Elders in your life with understanding and submitting their vote.

Shareholders are encouraged to discuss this initiative and its impact with other shareholders and their families. 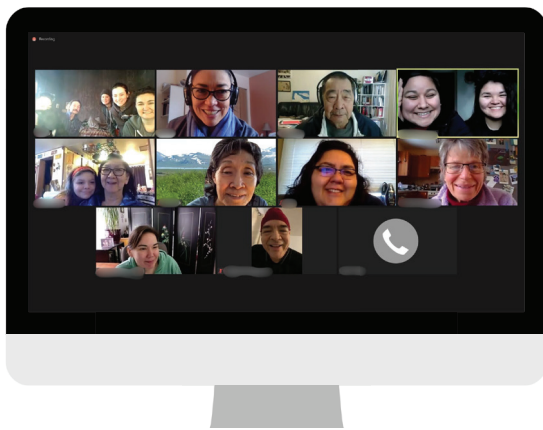
